OBJECTIVES AND ACTIVITIES

Objectives and significant activities during the year

The objects of the society are to encourage, improve and extend the cultivation of the dahlia by means of publications, the holding of exhibitions, judging examinations, conferences, lectures, trials or by any other means.

Annual General Meeting

The Annual General meeting was held at Kenilworth High School on Sunday 17th March 2019.

Any Other Business

Mr Cheetham gave a presentation on progress with a replacement website.

A full report of the AGM was published in the NDS Annual 2019.

Finance Committee

The year has seen a significant contribution to the finances from our fundraising activities e.g. sale of baskets and blooms at shows.

Membership income has exceeded budget with the new web site contributing 45 new members and £600 in sale of goods in its first 2 months of operation.

Overall, against a forecast operating budget deficit of £9,245, the expected final accounts anticipate a deficit of around £2,700. This excludes the investment on the new web site of nearly £26,000.

The impact on cash flow has been examined and it is expected that we will cash in the remaining government Stock and some of the investments with Greystones, resulting in a cash release of £20,000.

The situation then will be: total funds £82,000 of which £20,000 is cash in the bank.

Now the web site is up and running, the last Direct Debits were taken in Dec 19 and Jan 20 by the 'old paper based' mandates. From then on only Direct Debits set up by members on the new web site will be used. This will enable us to close the RBS bank account and save quite an amount of bank and DD processing charges.

As a continuing plan to simplify the accounts, we de-registered from VAT at the end of October 2019.

My thanks go to all members and trustees of the society for their contributions and support for another successful year.

OBJECTIVES AND ACTIVITIES

Objectives and significant activities during the year

General Purposes Committee

The first outing for the GP Committee every year is the Malvern Spring Show. We have been doing this for many years but because the show is in May and we don't usually have flowers we have always done a bureau aimed at educating the public on dahlia cultivation and we have never won a medal, until this year. This year largely thanks to the kind donation of some flowers from Pheasant Acre Nurseries we won a Bronze Medal. Next year with more flowers we hope to improve on this. This year for the first time we were allowed to sell plant material for the duration of the show, this made a huge difference in the public interest and to our profits. Thanks to all who provided plants and helped on the bureau - it's a long show but one very well worth visiting.

At the Plant Society Sale at Wisley on Saturday and Sunday the 15th and 16th June the NDS had a very successful weekend. A profit of nearly £1100.00 was made from plant sales. Our thanks go out to all the generous donors from the NDS who produced so many plants in such immaculate condition.

The General Purposes Committee also had a bureau at our National Show at RHS Wisley for all 6 days of the show. As well as the ever-popular tombola we also advised visitors on the growing and identification of dahlias and also recruited many new members. Once again, we need to thank so many NDS members for manning the bureau over the 6 days of the show with such good humour but also with such immense expertise.

The grand finale of the year was our Gold Medal winning stand and bureau at the Malvern Autumn Show. Only 25 of these were awarded over the whole show and when you consider that these are RHS medals and that we are competing against all the professional nurseries and the other societies this is a great achievement. The weather had been so bad the week prior to the show that we were amazed by the amount and quality of blooms that members from the Midlands and West Sussex brought along. A display of "blue dahlias" was certainly a talking point. Many thanks to all who provided blooms, arranged them and built the stand and manned the bureau for the duration of the show.

Note: we can never have too many volunteers helping on our bureaux. If you can help at any of them you get free entry into the shows and time to have a look round the show.

Show Committee The Show Committee meet three times outside of EC Meetings through the year, in January and July they meet at Wisley to finalise arrangements for the Wisley Show, and again in October to go through the Schedule for the forthcoming year.

A full report of the show is included elsewhere in the NDS 2020 Winter Bulletin.

The show lasts for 7 days and requires significant assistance to ensure it is successful. We are always looking for more people to assist and if you are able to volunteer any time, please contact the General Secretary.

The date for the NDS National Dahlia Show 2020 will be the 8th to 11th September. The RHS Wisley Flower Show will be 8th to 13th September 2020.

Judging Committee

We held a very successful judging exam at Kenilworth 2019 with seven candidates taking the judging exam and six passes.

The new judges are included in the changes to the 34th edition of the classified directory.

Please note the change to the rules of judging in the new classified directory 34th edition with regards to the presence of embryo buds rule 8 page 90.

Publications Committee

The Publication Committee has worked extremely hard and have had a very busy year under the Chairmanship of Brenda Thomas and Dave Bates as editor. They have prepared and produced three publications the 2019 Annual, the 2020 Winter Bulletin, and the 34th Edition Classified Directory which was available at the National Show in September ready for the 2020 Dahlia Season. The committee also prepared both Schedules for the National Show at Wisley and the Northern Harrogate Show.

Many hours are spent formatting the show results from both the Wisley and Harrogate Shows for the Winter Bulletin by Dave Bates. The committee also seek quotes for the Printing Publications and Art Work Design.

Many hours are spent by the Publication Committee proof reading our Publications prior to printing, for which we thank our Publication Team very much.

Rob Cheetham has worked particularly hard this year setting up the new Website that was launched in September, we thank him very much for all of his time and effort on this mammoth task.

Within the new Website there is a section for Affiliated Societies to put information about their own activities and shows, so please take advantage of this as there are no charges attached, you just need a nominated person from your own Society to log in and add your information.

The Facebook page introduced by Dave Gillam now has well over 5000 members, which is most encouraging, as it is introducing new members to participate in our Society and Shows.

We are always very pleased to receive articles of interest for our Annual which members enjoy reading. Please send them to Brenda Thomas or Dave Bates. Closing date for the 2020 Annual, including Show Adverts for Affiliated Societies is 30th April 2020.

Classification Committee

The Committee have produced the 34th edition of the Classified Directory. They have modified the definition of a decorative bloom to try to resolve the ball/decorative/neither problem to make it clearer to both exhibitors and judges.

Exhibition Trials Committee

The Committee held a successful trial once again at Golden Acre Park, Leeds. The results are recorded elsewhere in this Bulletin. They are now looking for entries for the trials for 2020.

Acknowledgements

The Executive Council wishes to record its sincere thanks to the many people, companies and organisations who have donated time, money or goods to the Society this year. We could not have had such a successful year without your help- thank you all.

Public benefit

The Trustees confirm that they have had regard to the guidance contained in the Charity Commission's general guidance on public benefit when reviewing the Charity's objectives.

Volunteers

The charity makes use of volunteers. These contributions cannot be reliably quantified and these services are therefore not recognised in the financial statements.

FINANCIAL REVIEW

Financial position

Net expenditure for the year amounted to £5,655 (2018: expenditure of £7,614). The charity has investments of £73,525 and cash held of £26,600.

Reserves policy

The Executive Committee have reviewed the Charity's needs for reserves in line with the guidance issued by the Charity Commission. The Executive Committee believe the charity should hold a minimum of £10,000 in order to cover the cost in the event of closure.

ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of preparing the financial statements

The financial statements of the charity, which is a public benefit entity under FRS 102, have been prepared in accordance with the Charities SORP (FRS 102) 'Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) (effective 1 January 2015)', Financial Reporting Standard 102 'The Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland' and the Charities Act 2011. The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention with the exception of investments which are included at market value, as modified by the revaluation of certain assets.

Income

All income is recognised in the Statement of Financial Activities once the charity has entitlement to the funds, it is probable that the income will be received and the amount can be measured reliably.

Expenditure

Liabilities are recognised as expenditure as soon as there is a legal or constructive obligation committing the charity to that expenditure, it is probable that a transfer of economic benefits will be required in settlement and the amount of the obligation can be measured reliably. Expenditure is accounted for on an accruals basis and has been classified under headings that aggregate all cost related to the category. Where costs cannot be directly attributed to particular headings they have been allocated to activities on a basis consistent with the use of resources.

Intangible fixed assets

Website development costs are capitalised and amortised over their expected useful economic life of ten years.

Tangible fixed assets

Depreciation is provided at the following annual rates in order to write off each asset over its estimated useful life.

Office equipment

- 20% on cost

Stocks

Stocks are valued at the lower of cost and net realisable value, after making due allowance for obsolete and slow moving items.

Taxation

The charity is exempt from tax on its charitable activities.

Fund accounting

Unrestricted funds can be used in accordance with the charitable objectives at the discretion of the trustees.

Restricted funds can only be used for particular restricted purposes within the objects of the charity. Restrictions arise when specified by the donor or when funds are raised for particular restricted purposes.

Further explanation of the nature and purpose of each fund is included in the notes to the financial statements.
