

RULES AND REGULATIONS

- 1. All exhibits become the property of the Society for sale by auction on the close of the Show unless clearly marked **Not for Sale** (labels provided).
- 2. All exhibits must be grown by the exhibitor personally, except where otherwise stated. Any exhibitor not conforming to this rule will forfeit all prize money that may have been awarded and will be debarred from exhibiting in any future Shows.
- 3. Any exhibitor may make more than one entry in one class, but no exhibitor will be allowed to take more than two prizes in one class.
- 4. Any objection must be made **to the Show Secretary before 2pm** on the day of the Show, accompanied by a deposit of £1 which will be refunded if the objection is upheld.
- 5. Entry form(s) for entries in the main classes, **Sections 1 to 5, MUST be delivered** to the Show Secretary by 6.30pm on Wednesday 3rd September.
- 6. Entry forms for entries in Novice Sections and the Children's Classes can be made up to 9am on the day of the Show but it would be helpful if entry forms could be delivered to the Show Secretary by 6.30pm on Wednesday 3rd September.
- 7. No late entries allowed.
- 8. **Staging is from 4.45pm until 8.45pm on Friday 5**th September (lighting will be provided) and from **6.30am until 9.20am on Saturday 6**th **September**. All entries **MUST** be staged before 9.20am ready for judging at 9.30am.
- 9. No exhibit may be removed before 4pm. Exhibits not removed by 4.15pm will be auctioned by the Committee.
- 10. The Committee will not be responsible for any loss or damage to the exhibits during the Show, but all ordinary care will be taken of them.
- 11. All matters of dispute arising during the Show, not legislated for in these rules, shall be decided by the Committee.
- 12.If there is a tie on points it will be decided in favour of the exhibitor with the most first prizes. 1st prize 3 points; 2nd prize 2 points; 3rd and 4th prize 1 point.
- 13. Prize money will be paid on the day of the Show at approximately 2pm and presentation of the trophies will be at 3.30pm
- 14. Engraving of trophies by winners is **NOT** permitted.
- 15. Commercial growers are **NOT** allowed to show.
- 16. Artificial foliage and flowers are not allowed in any exhibit in the Show.
- 17.All Dahlias, Chrysanthemums, Gladiola, Roses and vegetables exhibited in competitive classes must be qualified for the class in which they are shown by (a) classification and/or (b) formation and size.
- 18. Trophies **MUST** be returned to the Show Secretary **14 days prior to the Show**, in a clean condition.

Special note: All judging will be to The National Dahlia Society, The National Chrysanthemum Society and The National Vegetable Society Rules




